PATHFINDER

Pathfinder's objective is **to build resilient**, **economically active refugee and host communities** capable of determining their own futures.

It does this through aligning the training offered to the local context, while making participants job-ready through career councelling, coaching and networking for internships and eventual job placement.

It has the following components:

Early Childhood Development Teacher Training
Community and Business Development (CBD)
Primary Teacher Education Preparation (PTEP)
Professional Courses and Digital Literacy / IT Skills




EDUCATION

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

The inclusive education program seeks to provide safe and child friendly spaces to children not enrolled in or participating in Education.

The service in these safe spaces aim at increasing the ability of these children to participate in opportunities comparable to their peers, offering formal Education.

- Provides <u>protection spaces</u>, <u>psychosocial support</u>, <u>and essential basic services</u> for children with intellectual and physical disabilities.
- <u>Community outreach programs</u> in Kakuma and Kalobeyei seek to empower the community to support those with disabilities through early identification and referral.
- Home-bound children with disabilities are served through <u>home visits, counselling, home schooling</u> for children with special needs, and <u>psychomotor skills</u> intervention.



OUR PROGRAMES

PROTECTION

SAFE HEAVEN

The Safe Haven is a <u>secure and protected environment</u> <u>for those at risk of further violence and/or abduction</u>. Issues such as domestic violence, forced marriage and child abduction are so common in the camp and only the most serious cases are referred to the Safe Haven. In past years the majority of women welcomed into the Safe Haven have experienced life-threatening attacks from their perpetrators.

Women in the Safe Haven receive **psychosocial support**, **vocational training** such as bead work, catering, and embroidery.

Amani boys centre holds teenage boys between 11 and 18 years of age who are at risk of blood revenge, abduction, domestic violence or are simply unaccompanied minors.



EDUCATION

SCHOLARSHIPS

JRS aims to improve self-reliance of urban refugees through access to quality education by providing them **secondary** and tertiary education scholarships and psychosocial support.

Secondary education targets those who are 14-18 years old while tertiary education targets those who are 18-40 years old.

PATHFINDER

Through the **scholarship**, which is being implemented in partnership with U.S-based Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) along with the Global Education Movement (GEM), This project hopes **to enable refugees to attain protection**, **opportunity and participation**.

The JRS/SNHU degree program that is open to people of all ages and faiths is **competency-based**, thereby allowing the students to study by doing projects that translate to their university credits.



OUR PROGRAMES

EMERGENCY

EMERGENCY SUPPORT

This component provides emergency support with:

Food vouchers, Rent, and

Medical services

to help refugees who are facing extreme difficulties while supporting them to get back on their feet through counselling services.

This services are offered to refugees who walk in the office regardless if they have been benefiting from any other before. Interviews and needs assessments are carried out to allocate resources the best as possible.

Parallel, this service is also offered to any already-enrolled beneficiary that is found to be in need of basic support.




LIVELIHOODS

MIKONO SHOP

The project **supports crafts artisans with market linkage** to ensure they create value for their handicrafts through Mikono Refugee Craft Shop. Through the online shop and planned exhibitions within Nairobi, we expect they will widen their market reach, turn over their products quickly forming a steady income for their self-reliance.

MIKONO FARM

The agribusiness project supports a new cohort every year through training in breading and agriculture production and value addition. This will place them at an advantage to maximize their profit by increasing their involvement in the food value chain.

GRANTS & LOANS

Business skills training, and Business mentorship.

Apart from the grant, the beneficiaries also receive business skills training to ensure they have the ability and understanding on how to run their business well.

This is done by qualified facilitators with experience in business training to build their capacity to run and successfully manage their business.
